SETTLING IN: INFORMATION FOR EU STUDENTS

REGISTERING YOUR PLACE OF STAY IN THE POPULATION REGISTER

After moving to a new residence, the individual must submit a written residence notice to the respective local government agency, this being the Tallinn City District Administration Office.

Please take with you:

- Your rental agreement
- Identification document
- Notice of place of residence (filled during the Welcome Week)

There are several city district government offices in Tallinn, and any one of them can be used to register one's place of residence. The closest one to Tallinn University of Technology is:

Public transportation: Bus no 36 from TalTech towards Mustamäe to 'Kaja' stop or go on foot 10 min.

If your residential address changes, your new address has to be registered at your local City District Administration Office within 30 days.

When you are leaving Tallinn, please unregister at the same City District Administration Office at which you originally registered your home address.

If there is any money left on your Ühiskaart (public transportation Smartcard) that you would like to get back, or if you want to recycle your card, please go to the office of Tallinn City Government (Vabaduse väljak 7, 1st floor), or the R-Kiosk in the Port or Airport.

APPLYING FOR AN ESTONIAN ID CARD

Citizens of the member states of the European Union and the European Economic Area and the Swiss Confederation ("EU citizens") have the right to stay in Estonia on the basis of a valid travel document or identity card for the period of up to 3 months/90

days. Later the registration of place of residence and applying for Estonian ID card is required.

An EU citizen must, register their place of residence, personally contact the Police and Boarder Guard Board to apply for an Estonian ID card which certifies their right of temporary residence in Estonia. Please keep in mind that you can only apply for the Estonian ID card after you have registered your place of residence.

Besides being one of the requirements for residing in Estonia, the ID card gives you certain advantages such as, for example, being the only identity document to be accepted on the internet. The ID card enables you to get great discounts when using public transportation, and you can use internet banking, book cinema tickets, use e-libraries, Moodle and web-based study information system ÖIS, and also printing services at TalTech. If you have lost your ID card or if you experience any problems using e-services, please call the ID card helpline on 1777 or +372 677 3377 (when calling from abroad).

Take these documents with you to apply:

- Application form (this can be filled out at the Police and Boarder Guard Board)
- Identification document
- Document showing that you have paid the state fee (you can also pay the fee at the Police and Boarder Guard Board)
- Colour photo 4 x 5 cm (this can also be taken at the Police and Boarder Guard Board Office, free of charge).

Go to the **Police and Boarder Guard Board. The closest one to the Tallinn University of Technology is the Tammsaare Service Point.**

SETTLING IN: INFORMATION FOR NON-EU STUDENTS

APPLYING FOR D-VISA

Exchange students from third countries that come to Estonia for period of less than a year, cannot obtain a temporary residence permit. You must apply for D-Visa in Estonian Police and Border Guard Board, if you did not already apply for it before your arrival.

When non-EU student holds a Residence Permit or D-type visa of any other EU Country, which is issued for **study purpose**, (it has to be written on the document, based on the EU directive 2016/801) and the Residence Permit/Visa is valid during the study period, the student has a right to study in Estonia.

D-visa may be issued **for the period of stay of up to 365 days within twelve consecutive months** and it allows to stay in other Schengen Member States up to 90 days within the period of 180 days. The students get it for their study period.

How to fill in the electronic visa application form?

1. Open the page <https://eelviisataotlus.vm.ee/> in the web browser
2. Select a long-stay visa (D visa) to apply for a visa at the PBGB service.
3. Then select the appropriate language.
4. Enter the correct email address and the required characters.
5. Fill in the fields of the visa application according to the instructions. You will receive a numbered application at the end of the process.
6. Print and sign the completed form. (The completed form will be sent to your email address, so you can print it out later).
7. Bring the signed form with the necessary documents to the service to start applying for a visa (preferably to book an appointment in advance).

NB! In order to submit a visa application you will need to make an appointment with the Police and Border Guard service Office. For that, you will get the university confirmation from the Mobility Centre.

The nearest Office to TalTech is, Tammsaare Service Office A. H. Tammsaare tee 47, Tallinn. **It could be that you must wait a long time long time your appointment, therefore try to register your appointment as soon as possible. Online registration is required before the visit. To book your visit, please follow the guidelines:**

MIGRATION ADVISORS

Migration advisors at the Police and Border Guard Board will help you to understand the legal details in relation to your temporary residence permit for studies, temporary residence permit for work, long-term residence permit, etc.

Counselling is provided over the phone, by email, online and face to face. Make an appointment with a consultant or an online counseling slot ahead of time.

STUDY PLAN FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

Exchange students can only enroll in courses listed in the exchange student course catalogue. You can find the catalogue on our website taltech.ee/en/courses-english. This ensures that the courses will have available spots for exchange students and are conducted entirely in English. Course spots are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

Exchange students should make out their study plans by themselves. Each exchange student has an individual study plan. Timetables are available at tunniplaan.taltech.ee in a general format or will appear to student.taltech.ee after you have declared your courses in our study information system or ÖIS for short. To see the timetable in a general format on tunniplaan.taltech.ee you don't need to have your Uni-ID.

Please note that the timetables may change. When you take courses from different schools and programmes, make sure that the course times do not overlap. Basics of Physical Movement timetables are not available on tunniplaan.taltech.ee – you can find these at the web page taltech.ee/en/basics-of-physical-movement. After you have received your Uni-ID account for ÖIS access by e-mail, by declaring your courses (my study information → my study plan) and waiting for it to appear to the student portal (student.taltech.ee). After the personal study plan is available, you can export to put the courses in your regular calendar app.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT GRADING

Some lectures, seminars, and laboratory exercises are evaluated as 'pass' or 'fail'. These include Estonian Language and Culture, language courses, and Basics of Physical Movement (sports). TalTech cannot officially convert your grades to match your home university's grading system. This means that if you take a pass/fail course and your home university does not accept pass/fail grades, we cannot provide a numerical grade instead. If you need credits for a course that is graded pass/fail but your home university does not accept this grading system, please look for an alternative course in the exchange student course catalogue.

OFF-CAMPUS

If you are looking for privately rented accommodation in Tallinn, you have plenty of options depending on your needs and interests.

Apartment prices depend on the location and the number of rooms. Utilities are usually not included in monthly rental prices and, depending upon the building, can vary greatly. We advise you to ask in advance about the possible monthly costs of utilities. Tenants can also request to see bills from previous years so that they can estimate the overall costs for winter and summer months. The rent during winter is higher than in the Autumn and Spring. One of the biggest expenses is usually heating during the winter period. Very often the first payment consists of one month deposit and two months' rent.

MEDICAL INSURANCE AND HEALTHCARE

The European Health Insurance Card (EHIF) is a free card that gives the citizens of EU Member States access to medically necessary state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in any of the 28 EU countries, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland, under the same conditions and the same cost (free in some countries) as people insured in that country. Cards are issued by your national health insurance provider.

The European Health Insurance Card:

- is not alternative to travel insurance. It does not cover any private healthcare or costs, such as a return flight to your home country or lost/stolen property
- does not cover your costs if you are travelling for the express purpose of obtaining medical treatment
- does not guarantee free services. As each country's healthcare system is different, services that cost nothing at home might not be in another country

When you move your primary residence to another country, you should register with the S1 form and deregister from the previous health system instead of using the EHIF to receive medical care in your new country of habitual residence.

We strongly recommend you to take an additional health insurance for your study period in Estonia.

FAMILY DOCTOR:

To register your family doctor, you must submit a signed application to the doctor you have chosen. The application will be reviewed within 7 days, after which the selected family doctor will let you know if you have been accepted to the doctor's list. After the doctor has confirmed accepting you, you are officially registered with the clinic starting from the first date of the following month.

As it takes time to find the family doctor and then get the appointment at family doctor, we recommend private hospitals and clinics:

Dental care in Estonia is subject to a fee for adults. If you need dental care, contact a dentist and check, does he/she speaks a language that you can understand.

FAMILY DOCTOR OR EMERGENCY ROOM?

Everyone wants to know, where to turn for the quickest help in the event of an unexpected health problem. The initial care needed can be given by a family doctor or nurse at your own family clinic. The Emergency Room at a hospital offer unavoidable care, which is medical care that must be given immediately to avoid permanent injury or death. The waiting time could be for hours.

There are two Emergency Centres:

Ravi street 18 near Endla accommodation and J. Sütiste tee 19 near campus.

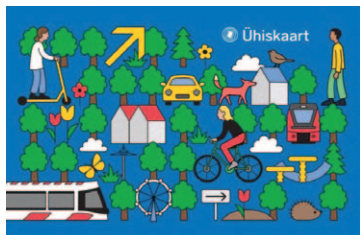

HOW TO OBTAIN YOUR PUBLIC TRANSPORT CARD

Everyone in Tallinn who has registered their residential address (EU citizens) can use public transport for free with the Public Transport Card – Ühiskaart (Smartcard). Anyone who has not registered their residential address in Tallinn or who is not a Tallinn resident (student with visas from third-party countries and EU students, or anyone who has not yet received their ID card), cannot make use of the discounts for Tallinn residents and will have to buy credit for the card system from authorised sellers (R-kiosks, Post Offices). After buying your card for 3 € you will have to activate your card and add your personal details to it.



If you are eligible for any discounts, you must personalise your Smartcard in order to be able to make use of these discounts. Personalising cards is free, so either do it online (pilet.ee) or in the public service office of Tallinn City Government (Vabaduse väljak 7). Elsewhere the service costs €1. Personalised e-tickets are only valid with proof of identity (an Estonian ID card). The Public Transport Card can also be replaced by another contact-free card (e.g. a student card) which meets the RFID technology standard.

Validate your journey with the Public Transport Card immediately after entering a public transport vehicle. Electronic validators are located alongside every door in all public transportation vehicles.

TICKETS

It is possible to purchase 1hr ticket from the validator at the public transport vehicle using contactless bank card. Tickets prices may change during the semester.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARD – ISIC

As a student in Estonia, you can apply for the International Student Identity Card (ISIC). The card can be obtained from the TALTECH Student Union Office (U01-217).

ORDERING ISIC ONLINE (only if You have an Estonian Identification Code)

Visit <https://eduid.ee/for-international-students> and log in with Your ID-card/Smart-ID/Mobil-ID and order the card. You can find a short manual here: HOW TO. If an error occurs, try to log out and back in and start over, if You are still not able to complete the order please contact eyl@eyl.ee or call +372 640 0422.

ORDERING ISIC (if you don't have an Estonian Identification Code)

You can fill out an application for a 1-year-card or 2-year-card. Fill out the application in our office (U01-217) or print it (1-year-card application; 2-year-card application) and bring the filled application to our office (U01-217), send us your digital portrait photo or take one with you (at least 307x372 pixels). In the Student Unions Office You can only pay by cash (please find the exact amount if possible). After filling out the signed application to Student Union Office, the card will be ready within 10 working days and you will receive an e-mail when you can pick it up.

ISIC card provides its holders with a number of discounts and special offers at shops, cinemas, theatres, various transportation services, sport clubs etc. in Estonia, as well as in many other countries in the world. Find all discounts from webpages www.isic.ee and www.isic.org.

With an ISIC card, you will get access to many library rooms and study rooms around campus. More information can be found here taltech.ee/en/campus

If you have Estonian ID-card or TRP and write your Estonian personal identification code on the application, you can use the student card as a public transport card.

There is also a possibility to get an ISIC-Maestro card. It is a student card and an international debit card altogether. You can get it from the nearest office of SEB

Bank, LHV Bank or SWEDBANK. Before applying go to the Dean's Office and ask for a confirmation letter, which proves that you are a student of TalTech.

NB: You only need one student card. If you already have an ISIC Maestro card then you don't need another student card.

ESTONIAN BANKS AND YOUR BANK ACCOUNT

International students usually open a bank account at one of the following banks:

- LHV lhv.ee
- Swedbank swedbank.ee
- SEB seb.ee

At some of the banks (SEB and Swedbank for example), it is possible to order an ISIC student card and a debit card in one. Please, refer to previous information about the ISIC card for more details.

Opening bank accounts can be expensive if you don't yet have your temporary residence permit (this is required for non-EU citizens). Different banks have different terms and conditions and also prices for their services, so it is advisable to research beforehand in order to find out which of the service providers is the most suitable for you.

NB: To open a bank account with LHV under special conditions (non-EU student with visa), please contact to Mobility Centre so that you can get a certificate which proves your student status at Tallinn University of Technology.

Open a bank account at LHV

Account opening for a student of TalTech is **free of charge** in LHV Pank and there is **no monthly fee**. Also, we offer **free European payments** and **instant payments**. If you are under the age of 26, your **bank cards are free from the monthly fees** as well. In LHV, we have a convenient and fast **internet bank**, so you could easily manage your funds without going to a bank office.

You can start applying for an account online and to start enjoying your time in Estonia, we suggest starting with it as soon as possible.

MIXED PACKAGING

✓ SUITABLE

- glass packaging
- metal packaging
- plastic packaging (incl. salad boxes, plastic bags, PVC foam)
- Tetra Paks (incl. juice and milk cartons)

! Hazardous waste must be discarded at special collection sites

✗ NOT SUITABLE

- dirty packaging
- rubber products
- packaging of hazardous waste



PAPER & CARDBOARD

✓ SUITABLE

- newspapers and magazines
- paper and cardboard packaging
- printer paper
- advertising materials and catalogues

! Materials must be clean and dry

✗ NOT SUITABLE

- dirty or wet paper and cardboard
- paper towels
- disposable tableware (incl. coffee cups)



BIOWASTE

✓ SUITABLE

- solid food waste
- coffee and tea containers
- paper towels
- plants

! Drain as much liquid as possible

✗ NOT SUITABLE

- liquid food waste
- cling film and packaging
- disposable tableware (except for biodegradable items)

EMERGENCY NUMBERS AND OTHER IMPORTANT CONTACT DETAILS

In case of emergency (police, ambulance, fire service) please call **112**.

Calls to emergency numbers are free of charge.

The medical emergency centre is located not far from TalTech at J. Sütiste tee 19. It is open 24/7. In order to visit, you need 5 € and your valid ID. EU-citizens also need to provide an EU health card. Another emergency centre is located at East-Tallinn Central Hospital, Ravi tn 18 (near Hotel Olümpia in the city centre). **There may be long queues and these centres are for emergencies only.** If you become ill with non-emergency symptoms then please, visit your general health practitioner (doctor) or a pharmacy. For a recommended doctor and dentist, please refer to the section 'Medical insurance and healthcare'. If you feel the need for urgent psychiatric help, you can turn to SA PERH Psychiatry Clinic, at Paldiski mnt 52, or telephone them on +372 617 2650.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS (DAYS OF REST)

1 JANUARY – New Year's Day

24 FEBRUARY – Independence Day (1918), the anniversary of the declaration which acted as the founding of the republic of Estonia. After this declaration was made, Estonia was forced to fight a war of independence against Soviet Russia in the east and Baltic-German forces in the south. During this war Estonia secured its borders and concluded the Tartu Peace Treaty with Soviet Russia on 2 February 1920.

FIRST SUNDAY AFTER THE FIRST FULL MOON OF SPRING – Easter Sunday

TWO DAYS BEFORE EASTER SUNDAY – Good Friday

1 MAY – Spring Day

SEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER SUNDAY – Pentecost

23 JUNE – Victory Day, which commemorates the victory of Estonian forces over those of the Baltic Germans (led by the Landswehr) at the Battle of Võnnu (Cesis) in northern Latvia in 1919, during which Estonian forces thwarted an attempt to restore Baltic-German control over the region. This day is marked by important official ceremonies.

24 JUNE – St John's Day or Midsummer's Day and its equally important Midsummer's Eve is a traditional celebration which is held on the night of 23 June. This day is the closest to the longest day of the year, when twilight and dawn appear to merge. The evening of the 23rd and well into the morning of the 24th is celebrated with bonfires and a traditional celebratory menu.

20 AUGUST – Restoration of Independence Day. Dramatic developments in the Soviet Union in August 1991 resulted in the three Baltic countries finally regaining their independence. On 20 August 1991 Estonia issued a decision confirming the re-establishment of its independence on the basis of the historical continuity of its statehood.

24 DECEMBER – Christmas Eve

25 DECEMBER – Christmas Day

26 DECEMBER – Boxing Day

NATIONAL HOLIDAYS

6 JANUARY – Epiphany

2 FEBRUARY – Anniversary of the Tartu Peace Treaty, which was signed on 2 February 1920 in Tartu, between Soviet Russia and Estonia. With this treaty Soviet Russia finally recognised the independence of Estonia.

14 MARCH – Native Language Day

SECOND SUNDAY OF MAY – Mothers' Day

1 JUNE – Children's Day

4 JUNE – National Flag Day. The Estonian tricolour flag was first consecrated as the flag of the Estonian Student Society on 4 June 1884 in Otepää.

14 JUNE – Day of Mourning and Commemoration. On 14 June 1941 the first mass deportation from the Baltic States took place. Over 10,000 Estonians were deported to Siberia. Another large-scale deportation took place in March 1949, when more than 20,000 Estonians were deported to Siberia. Altogether up to 60,000 Estonians were killed or deported in the 1940s.

23 AUGUST – European Day of Remembrance for Victims of Stalinism and Nazism

10 SEPTEMBER – (the second Sunday in September) Grandparents' Day

22 SEPTEMBER – Resistance Fighting Day. On 22 September 1944, Soviet troops conquered Tallinn. The Estonian national tricolour flag was torn from the flag pole on Tallinn's Pikk Hermann Tower and was replaced by the symbol of the new occupation, the Soviet banner.

1 OCTOBER – Local Self-Government Day

21 OCTOBER – (the third Saturday in October) Tribal Day or The Day of Finno-Ugric Peoples

2 NOVEMBER – All Souls' Day

SECOND SUNDAY OF NOVEMBER – Fathers' Day

16 NOVEMBER – Declaration of Sovereignty Day. On 16 November 1988, the Supreme Soviet of the Estonian SSR adopted a declaration of national sovereignty under which Estonian laws should take precedence over Soviet Union ones.

Academic year and terms – an academic year consists of two terms (autumn and spring terms). Both terms are sixteen weeks long, and at the end of each term, there is a three-week exam session.

Please take notice of the study weeks: the first week of each term is always week number one; therefore the term starts on an odd number, with the second week being an even number. Some lectures may take place every odd week, and others every even week. Some subjects are taught during the first half of the term – these subjects are marked S1 (autumn) or K1 (spring) – or during the second half of the term, marked S2 and K2 respectively.

ECTS – The European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) is a standard for comparing the study attainment and performance of students of higher education across the European Union and other collaborating European countries. One ECTS credit corresponds to 26 hours of study by a student.

Student code – at TalTech you need a unique student code, one which identifies the student. You will get your student code once you have logged into ÕIS system.

You will need your student code to enter all applications, tests, and other papers which you are handed while at the university.

Uni-ID provides access to the university's central ICT resources through a unified and secure authentication platform. Depending on the service, Uni-ID account holders can authenticate themselves with username and password or using an Estonian ID card, Mobile ID or Smart-ID.

Uni-ID account is created after matriculation automatically and you will receive a notification email with a one-time password and instructions to open your personal TalTech Uni-ID account in the <https://pass.taltech.ee>. Uni-ID will be closed one hundred days after exmatriculation of the student. After that student has no more access to services, their data and files associated with the Uni-ID account.

STUDENT PORTAL

The main purpose of the Student Portal (student.taltech.ee) is to provide the students of TalTech personalized information **about their studies**, all in one place. The Student portal provides support and functions as a collection of links and references to different information systems, so that it is easier for students to keep up to date with important matters. The portal also has an important role in introducing students the different services the University has to offer (counselling, seminars, events, news, important contacts etc.).

STUDY INFORMATION SYSTEM – ÕIS

ÕIS is the web-based study information system for TalTech in which you can:

- register for courses and exams
- submit applications (for scholarships, a thesis, etc.)
- provide feedback and receive your study results

Students are responsible for keeping their personal information properly updated (email address, phone number, place of residence in Estonia) via ÕIS.

The deadline for submitting your individual 'Study Plan' is announced each year in the academic calendar. You may register for courses until the deadline for submitting the final study plan, which is also listed in the academic calendar.

REGISTERING FOR BASICS OF PHYSICAL MOVEMENT COURSE

Basics of Physical Movement (PE) is part of the free study module. In order to enroll for PE classes, you must register via ÖIS. Enrolment takes place during the **first two weeks** of every term.

Students who don't pay a tuition fee can enroll in two terms of PE courses free of charge. After that, a small fee is applied. For fee-paying students, a fee for every course is applicable.

THE MEKTORY INNOVATION AND BUSINESS CENTRE

Tallinn University of Technology's Mektory Innovation and Business Centre is a home for the modern student. The centre offers a creative and playful work environment for students so that they are able to work on their ideas. We also have a wide range of laboratories for your prototyping needs.

Mektory's Innovation HUB combines the cooperation area for students and start-ups (200m²). It is a multifunctional area, where the students can carry out their projects, conduct seminars, trainings and hackathons (for ca 70 persons). In addition, it is a great place for organising development marathons in cooperation with companies, students, scientists and experts.

In Mektory, the students can prepare their prototypes/projects (3D printing workshop, Metal and wood works lab, virtual and augmented reality lab, electronics lab etc). TalTech's student satellite and Teadusklubi's e-foil team are working on their inventions in Mektory.



To encourage student entrepreneurship, twice a year TalTech runs a pre-incubation programme called STARTERtallinn. Students from different educational levels and institutions are welcome to participate. STARTERtallinn is a free interdisciplinary fourmonth

business development programme which consists of trainings, workshops, mentoring and coaching from top experts and entrepreneurs. Program ends with a competition of business ideas where winners can receive different prizes; e.g consultations and mentoring, access to different programmes and Prototron, tickets to startup events, free office space in Mektory and much more.

PSYCHOLOGICAL COUNSELLING

The purpose of psychological counselling is to support international students with study-related and personal challenges and difficulties. International students may experience similar difficulties to local students, however, they may face extra challenges and find it harder to adjust in a new environment. International students might feel isolated, miss the familiar, have difficulties understanding local culture or people and making new contacts, and have hard time adjusting to a different climate or a way of studying. Such topics and possible solutions to them can be discussed together with the psychologist.

Counselling sessions are confidential (information about a student's identity and the topics discussed will not be disclosed), and free of charge.

The library is located in the centre of the university campus, making it a convenient spot for studying and relaxing between lectures. **You do not need a library card to enter, but borrowing books and reserving rooms are only for registered members.** You can use your Estonian ID card, TRP or digi-ID (for free) or a separate card (costs 2 euros) as your library card. Alternatively, register at home via the library's website with a valid Estonian ID card.

The library offers five hundred different reading and study places and provides computers for its users on each floor. If you are coming with a group, we recommend that you **reserve one of our group study rooms in advance.** This way it is guaranteed that you have a place to study and will not disturb other readers when doing your assignments. We also have smaller individual study rooms available for reservation for those who like to have more quiet and private surroundings during studying. If you are a night owl, we even have a place for you – our **24/7 study room is open throughout day and night.**

The library holds a great collection of books for your studies. **Use our online portal PRIMO at taltech.ee/raamatukogu-portaal to search for books, journals and all other resources,** both online and physical. When you have acquainted yourself with the electronic resources, you can continue using them at home via VPN service with your Uni-ID. To help you with finding the right resources, referencing, and other literature-related questions we hold workshops and offer consultations, see taltech.ee/en/user-training for the schedule.



Most of our books can be taken home, usually for a one-month period for regular books and a three-month period for textbooks. You can **loan the books on each floor of the library** with the assistance of our librarians. We have also set up **self-service lending machines** on the 2nd and 3rd floors of the library for those who like to manage on their own. **When the due date arrives**, just return the books to our staff at service desks or return them to the **self-service book return machine** on the first floor. If you would like to continue using the books, make sure to let us know because a **fine will be charged for each day the books are late**. Certainly return all your books before leaving Estonia so that other students can use them in the future!

For those who want to **make printouts or copies**, we offer self-service equipment in the 2nd floor computer lab, on the third floor (both for coloured printing), and in the 1st floor 24/7 study room (B&W only). Create a user account and check the user guides at ee.printincity.com. Free of charge scanners are located on each floor. Our librarians are happy to assist you if you have any problems!
